Hi Lori,

The NSDL program came to the end of it's NSF funding at the end of 2014, including the funds that supported the Science Literacy Maps. We worked over a period of many months to find a host that could sustain and grow the library into the future, which is why we chose ISKME. [Read more in the announcement here.](#)

ISKME's OER Commons platform was able to accommodate the library collections and science resources, and offer a number of new features that were not previously available, but they were not able to host the Science Literacy Maps given time and budget constraints.

Fortunately, UCAR has graciously agreed to continue to host the Science Literacy Maps as part of it's education programs. Because of the transition we needed to change the the web address for the Maps, however all previous links and bookmarks will continue to work by redirecting users automatically to the new Science Literacy Maps site.

We would like to add Top Picks resources back into the Maps if funds can be found to support the work necessary to make the technical connections with the new OER Commons platform, or other content sources, but there are no plans to do so at this time. I'm hopeful we can do so at some point.

Will you be able to continue your study with the Science Literacy Maps at the new location?
